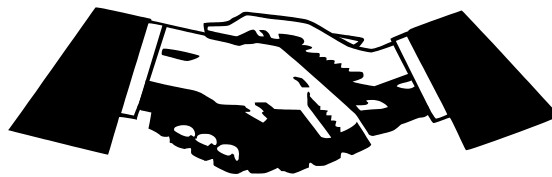

Title: Advances in chronic pain research: an overview of activity management, suicidal ideation and catastrophizing

- **Objectives:**
 - 1) *To understand the role that pain-related activity management patterns play in the development and maintenance of chronic pain disorders, especially in fibromyalgia syndrome.*
 - 2) *To Identify and target the general and pain-related at-risk factors for suicidality in patients with chronic pain.*
 - 3) *To understand the temporal relationship between changes in catastrophizing and changes in pain intensity and pain-related interference in patients with neuropathic pain.*
